

FAB Education Awards - Terms and conditions

1. The FAB Education Award scheme is open to all teachers of students aged 5-16 years located in Europe.
2. A maximum of up to two entries are allowed per school.
3. Award entries must include a completed Nomination form. The Nomination form is available online from CommNet and ESOF websites. This form must be completed in English.
4. The information provided on the Nomination form must be correct to the best of your knowledge. You warrant that you are entitled to send all details and materials relating to your entry to the organisers and that all materials are original and do not infringe any third party right.
5. Entries must satisfy the criteria of the competition by demonstrating a clear understanding of the science or area of interest by sharing activities through a case study in one of 3 formats:
 - photograph/s with accompanying dialogue (can be written or recorded);
 - a poster with accompanying dialogue (can be written or recorded);
 - short video (no longer than 3 minutes).
6. Judging criteria for the competition include:
 - demonstrating a clear understanding of the science/area of interest;
 - the application of this information in your case study;
 - demonstrating what the information presented means to entrants in their country;
 - engagement with your local community.
7. Any photographs of young people included in entries must receive guardian/parental permission. Permission will be requested after the closing date. If guardian/parental permission is not granted, the entries will be invalid.
8. All entries (Nomination forms and case study materials) should be emailed to: education@commnet.eu
9. The FAB Education Award scheme can take no responsibility for lost or delayed entries. An email to indicate proof of receipt will be sent once the entry has been received.
10. Winners may be asked to participate in publicity relating to this promotion.
11. By entering this award scheme you confirm that your entry is your own original work. By entering you agree that the entry may be used in the development of promotional materials which may be uploaded to the CommNet website and ESOF website without payment to you.
12. The four winners will each win €400.00 for their school, science department or science club.
13. The teacher submitting the entry will be responsible for administering any prize awarded to their school. Cash prizes for schools are to be spent on enhancing science and its communication, examples of this include new science equipment or education resources.
14. Details of winning entries will be posted at www.commnet.eu and <http://www.esof.eu/>
15. The judges' decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into. The Judging panel will consist of ESOF representatives (science experts), ESOF student representative and CommNet representatives (science & education expert).
16. Entries will not be returned.
17. The organisers of the FAB Education Awards scheme reserve the right to impose further conditions at the time any award is being made.
18. Closing date for receipt of entries is 30 April 2014.
19. Winners will be notified by telephone by 23 May 2014. A list of winners will be published on the CommNet and ESOF websites.
20. A teacher and student (and a chaperone if requested) representing each winning nomination will be invited to ESOF 21-26 June 2014 in Copenhagen to receive their prize and commemorative certificate. The opportunity to create a display about their case study and provide a brief presentation will also be available. Reasonable travel and accommodation costs will be provided.
21. Each winner will be invited to present their case study via a CommNet webinar.
22. Details of entrants shall be retained by CommNet for the purpose of this competition only. Entrants may withdraw their consent to the retention of such data at any time by declaring such withdrawal to the FAB Education Award scheme.
23. By entering, all entrants agree to abide by each and all of these terms and conditions.
